



### Italian Bookshelf

Forbidden Notebook by Alba de Cespedes Astra House 2023, 265 pages Review by Leita Kaldi Davis

Jhumpa Lahiri, renowned Indian author, wrote the introduction to *Quaderno Proibito*, a novel by the Italian-Cuban feminist writer Alba de Céspedes, whose work is translated by Ann Goldstein, Elena Ferrante's translator.

The Forbidden Notebook centers on the inner life of a dissatisfied middle-aged housewife living in postwar Rome. Valeria Cossati begins to realize how unhappy she has become with the shabby gentility of her bourgeois life when she begins to jot down her thoughts and feelings in a little black book she keeps hidden in a closet. Her secret writing reveals new insights and a sense that her being has been stifled by her dutiful devotion to her husband, daughter, and son. The grown children choose paths that are abhorrent to Valeria, and her husband seems oblivious to her presence. Their stories unfold and collide, eventually tearing the family's fragile fabric apart.


I found the book fascinating at first, its cover reminiscent of a soft old notebook. But Valeria's paranoia about the diary being discovered as she hides it night after night in various places, and her distress over each of her family members becomes redundant. The book reaches an arc only towards the end when Valeria must decide about an erstwhile lover.

I was more interested in the author than the book and will try to learn more about her. Alba de Céspedes (1911–1997) was a bestselling Italian-Cuban feminist writer greatly influenced by the cultural developments that led to and resulted from World War II. In 1935, she was jailed for her anti-fascist activities in Italy. Two of her novels were also banned—*Nessuno Torna Indietro* (1938) and *La Fuga* (1940). In 1943, she was again imprisoned for her assistance with Radio Partigiana in Bari, where she was a Resistance radio personality known as Clorinda. After the war, she moved to Paris, where she lived until her death in 1997.

# New College history professor, recent GCICS speaker, wins \$150,000 research grant.

New College of Florida history professor Carrie Beneš and her research team have been awarded a \$150,000 grant as part of the National Endowment for the Humanities Scholarly Editions and Translations program. Professor Benes was the featured speaker at a March 10 GCICS cultural event held at the New College of Florida auditorium.

The grant supports the La Sfera Project, an open-access multimedia edition of Goro Dati's 15th-century poem 'La Sfera' (The Globe). Beneš is leading a research team that includes Amanda Madden of George Mason University, Laura Ingallinella of the University of Toronto, and scholar Laura Morreale.

Beneš, a cultural historian of late medieval Italy whose research focuses on landscape, urban identity, and the classical tradition, will spend the 2023-24 year in Rome as Co-Principal Investigator and Director of Spatial Analysis for the Sfera Project. 'Goro Dati's work reveals fascinating webs of premodern intercultural trade and exchange, and I am glad we will have the opportunity to share it in a more accessible way through this work,' Beneš said.
