TOUR OF PATRIOT PLAZA AT THE SARASOTA NATIONAL CEMETERY RECAP

Tour Patriot Plaza At The Sarasota National Cemetery

On January 15, 2026, which just happened to be the worst weather day with high winds and chilling temperatures, fourteen brave GCICS souls braved a private tour of Patriot Plaza at the Sarasota National Cemetery.

Mike Loparca and Tom Smith, both decorated veterans and enthusiastic volunteers, helped us experience the astounding artwork and tributes to U.S. veterans. The group was split between the two so each group got exceptional personal attention. Mike did research on Italian American contributions in WW2 and made numerous connections between Italians and

military service and commitment. Tom had his own inspiring stories to share.

The highlighted artwork included mosaics, sculptures, photographs, stories of service in various conflicts as well as experiences back in civilian life. The Sarasota National Cemetery, a hallowed burial site for men and women who served our nation, was opened in 2009. Following the opening, the Patterson Foundation, working with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs National Cemetery Administration, created Patriot Plaza at the cemetery as a 2,800-seat ceremonial amphitheater.

Although the weather was challenging, the GCICS members and guests echoed a similar sentiment – that they must return and spend more time to fully absorb all that was there.
