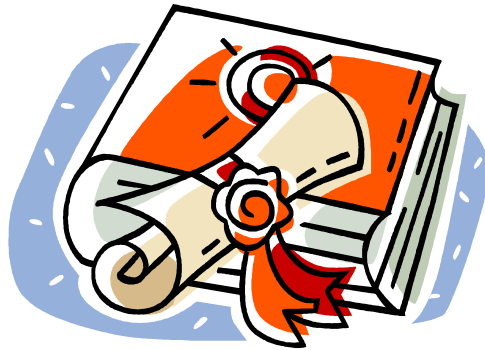

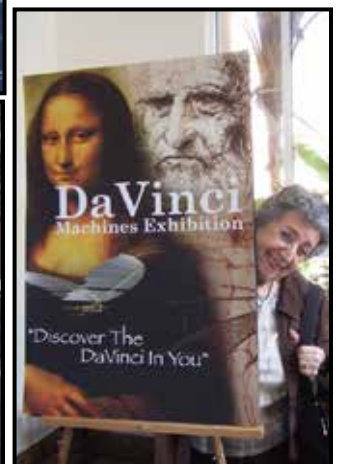
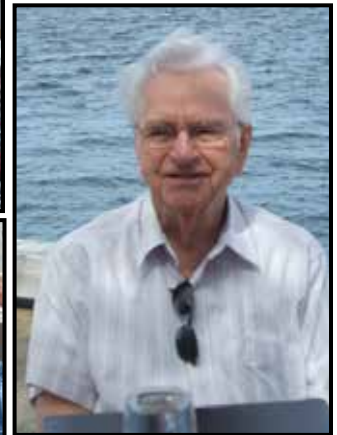

DA VINCI OUTING AND LUNCH

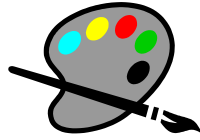

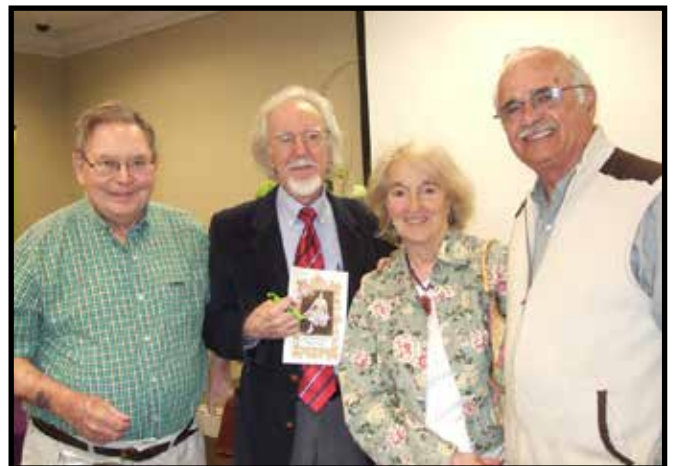
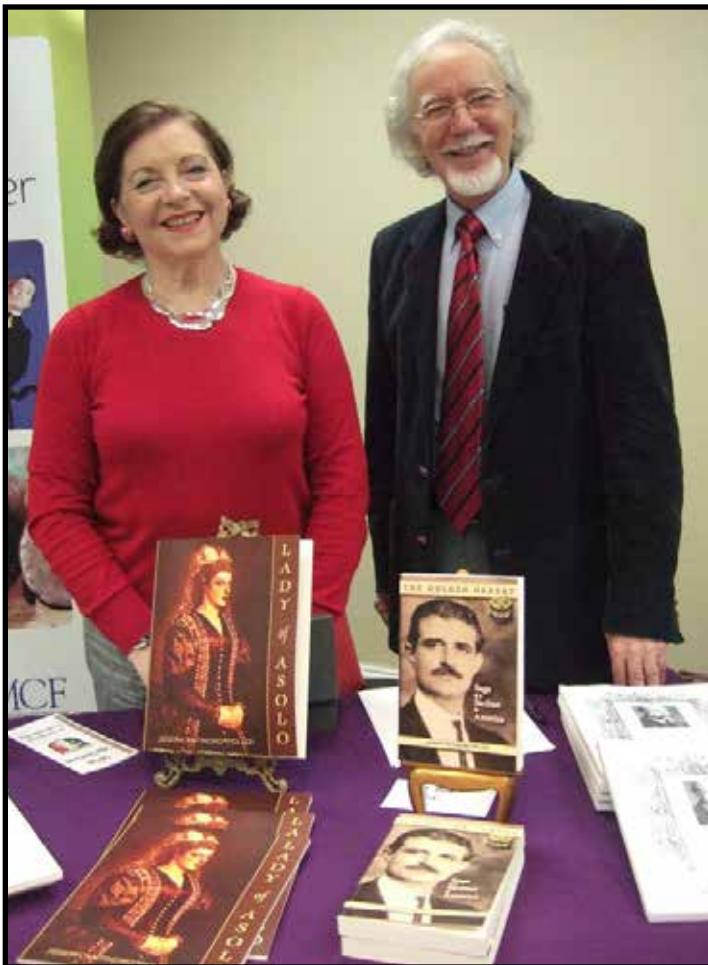

On March 7th, 2014 over 40 GCICS members and guests gathered at the Community Foundation to learn about Italian painters who left Italy for Paris in the 19th century to continue their careers in a very different environment. Our own Dr. Joseph (Joe) Polizzi amazed and amused us with his stories of these painters. Joe displayed reproductions of their works which he had purchased at an auction years ago. Joe was accompanied by Alexandra DeStefanis who is actively involved in Sister Cities International. She provided assistance to Joe with the setup and lecture, circulating with the prints for the audience to see “up close and personal.” He loves his Italian roots and conveyed this love throughout the lecture. Joe brought some of his books which sold out within 30 minutes. A book that was displayed was about Joe’s uncle who sold bananas in Johnstown, PA early in the 20th century. Quite by coincidence, Gene McLoone, a GCICS member, has a home in Johnstown—in the same community of Westmont where Joe’s uncle lived. When Gene and I return to Johnstown in May 2014, we plan to locate the two homes of Joe’s uncle and photograph them since Joe has not been to Westmont in many years. Dr. Polizzi is a true gentleman with a great love of Italian society and culture. We are so fortunate to have him as our GCICS colleague.
